out the award for the best dressed "Leprechaun".




Our final event for the month was an enjoyable train and ferry trip to Davistown for lunch.

Firefox and HTTPS

Among the many reasons I like to use Firefox (the world's third most used browser), is that it is the fastest, it offers many security features, its add-ons library contains more than 6,000 extensions and it has a good privacy mode.

When information is sent over regular HTTP, the information is broken into packets of data that can be easily "sniffed" using free software. This makes communication over an unsecure medium, such as public Wi-Fi, highly vulnerable to interception. In fact, all communications that occur over HTTP occur in plain text, making them highly accessible to anyone with the correct tools, and vulnerable to on-path attacks.

When S is added to HTTP, HTTPS prevents websites from having their information broadcast in a way that's easily viewed by anyone snooping on the network. HTTPS traffic is encrypted such that even if the packets are sniffed or otherwise intercepted, they will come across as nonsensical characters.

All reputable websites should now have switched to HTTPS. In Firefox an HTTPS-only mode is accessed by clicking the top right menu button (three horizontal lines), followed by Privacy and Security, now scroll down and select "enable HTTPS-only Mode in all windows."

Then Firefox will take you only to HTTPS pages as you browse the web. You will see an error message if you try to visit an HTTP page, however, you can over-ride the warning and continue if you know the site (an example is www.bom.gov.au which is not an https website as you might expect).



Firefox Browser, also known as Mozilla Firefox or simply Firefox, is a free and open-source web browser developed by the Mozilla Foundation and its subsidiary, the Mozilla Corporation. Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure is an extension of the Hypertext Transfer Protocol. It is used for secure communication over a computer network, and is widely used on the Internet. In HTTPS, the communication protocol is encrypted using Transport Layer Security or, formerly, Secure Sockets Layer. [Wikipedia](#)
